He also served as Deputy Division Chief in the IMF's Asia and Pacific Department, was chief of mission for the Maldives and Bangladesh, and a member of the Singapore, Malaysia, and New Zealand teams. He also served as Senior Economist in the IMF's Western Hemisphere Department as a member of the team for Costa Rica and El Salvador. Prior to that, he was a professor of economics at Oxford University and a lawyer and tax manager for KPMG Costa Rica.

He joined the BLP team as Senior Counsel in 2022.
